### **About the Standards Databases**

The Standards databases are updated based on market requirements and are distributed on a DVD separate from the products.

You can choose to run the standards directly from the DVD instead of installing them on your hard drive. This requires approximately 10 MB of hard drive space. If you currently run the standards from DVD, no installation is necessary -- simply replace the old DVD with the new one.

### **Prerequisites for Installing the Standards Databases**

The following are prerequisites for installing the Standards databases:

- 1. Install your base product first before you install the standards database.
- 2. If Microsoft Data Access Components (MDAC) are required for your base product), install MDAC before you install the standards database. See the documentation for your base product to determine if MDAC is required, and, if so, which version of MDAC to use.
- 3. Ensure that there is sufficient free space on the drive where you are installing the standards.
- 4. For the Sterling Standards Database for CII, ensure you have at least 7.2 MB of space available.
- 5. For the HIPAA standards, ensure you have at least 7 MB of space available.
- 6. If you use Sterling Gentran:Server for Windows, you need 600 MB hard disk space available to install the Sterling Standards Database for EDI and 7.2 MB available to install the Sterling Standards Database for CII.
- 7. If you use Sterling Gentran:Server for UNIX, you need 600 MB hard disk space available to install the EDI standards.
- 8. If you use Sterling Gentran:Director, you need 600 MB hard disk space available to install the EDI standards.
- 9. If you are using Sterling B2B Integrator, for the Sterling Standards Database for EDI, ensure you have at least 565 MB of space available.

## Installing the EDI Database with Sterling Gentran: Server for Windows, Gentran:Server for UNIX, or Gentran:Director

#### **About this task**

To install the Sterling Gentran Standards Database for EDI with Sterling Gentran:Server for Windows, Sterling Gentran:Server for UNIX, or Sterling Gentran:Director, follow this procedure:

#### **Procedure**

- 1. On the computer where you are installing the standards, close all programs, then insert the EDI Standards disc into the disc drive on the computer.
- 2. Select Run from the Windows Start menu.

- 3. Type drive\_letter:\I386\setup.exe where drive\_letter is the drive letter for your disc drive (for example, D:\ or E:\). Setup prepares the wizard that guides you through the install program. This may take several seconds. The Welcome dialog box is displayed.
- 4. Click Next. The Install Standards dialog box is displayed.
- 5. If you select **Install to run from the disc**, click **Next** to proceed with step 7 (Select ODBC Data Source). If you select **Install to run without the disc**, click **Next** to proceed with step 6 (Standards Destination). The Standards Destination dialog box is displayed.
- 6. Accept the default location, type a different destination in the box, or click Browse to select the directory where the standards should be installed. Click Next to proceed with step 7. If there is insufficient space available on the drive you specify, you will be prompted to select another location or increase the amount of space available in the target directory. Click OK to acknowledge the message. You are returned to the Install Standards dialog box (step 5). The Select ODBC Data Source dialog box is displayed.
- 7. Accept the default, Gentran Standards, and click Next to proceed with step 8.
- 8. Click **Yes** on the ready to install dialog box. If you receive a message that a .DLL is currently in use, click **Ignore** to continue the installation. You receive these messages when a service (such as the SQL Executive service) is running in the background. The standards database will still be installed correctly. Setup prompts you that the Sterling Gentran Standards Database for EDI setup is complete.
- 9. Click **OK** to exit.

## Installing the CII Database with Sterling Gentran:Server for Windows About this task

To install the Sterling Standards Database for CII with Sterling Gentran:Server for Windows, follow this procedure:

#### **Procedure**

- 1. On the computer where you are installing the standards, close all programs, then insert the EDI Standards DVD into the DVD drive on the computer.
- 2. Select Run from the Windows Start menu.
- 3. Type drive\_letter:\CII\GentranCIIStandards.exe where drive\_letter is the drive letter for your DVD drive. Setup prepares the wizard that guides you through the install program. This may take several seconds. The Welcome dialog box is displayed.
- 4. Click **Next**. The Choose Destination dialog box is displayed.
- Accept the default location, type a different destination in the box, or click Browse to select the directory where the standards should be installed. Click Next to proceed.
- 6. Accept the default, **CII**, and click **Next** to proceed. Setup prompts you that the Sterling Standards Database for CII installation is complete.
- 7. Click **Finish** to exit.

## Removing the EDI Database for Sterling Gentran:Server for Windows, Gentran:Server for UNIX, or Gentran:Director

#### **About this task**

To remove the Sterling Gentran Standards Database for EDI and its associated ODBC data source by completing the following procedure.

#### **Procedure**

- 1. From the Windows Start menu, select Settings > Control Panel > Add/Remove Programs.
- 2. Select **Change or Remove Programs** and the list of currently installed programs is displayed.
- 3. From the list, select the appropriate standards program and click **Change/Remove**. You are prompted to completely remove the standards and all of the associated components.
- 4. Click **Yes** to uninstall the standards.
- 5. Open the Windows ODBC Data Source Administrator and delete the data source created during the EDI standards installation. The default data source name is **Gentran Standards**.

### Removing the CII Database for Sterling Gentran:Server for Windows or Gentran:Director

#### About this task

To remove the Sterling Standards Database for CII and its associated ODBC data source by completing the following procedure:

#### **Procedure**

- 1. From the Windows Start menu, select Settings > Control Panel > Add/Remove Programs.
- Select Change or Remove Programs and the list of currently installed programs is displayed.
- 3. From the list, select the appropriate standards program and click **Change/Remove**. You are prompted to completely remove the standards and all of the associated components.
- 4. Click **Yes** to uninstall the standards.
- 5. Open the Windows ODBC Data Source Administrator and delete the data source created during the Sterling Standards Database for CII installation. The default data source name is CII.

# Installing the Standards Databases with Sterling B2B Integrator (Windows Server)

#### About this task

To install the Sterling Standards Database for EDI and Sterling Standards Database for CII on a Windows server for Gentran Integration Suite or Sterling B2B Integrator, follow this procedure:

#### **Procedure**

- 1. Place the Standards Database disc in the appropriate drive.
- 2. Change directory to the bin subdirectory of your Sterling Integrator installation.
- 3. From the bin directory of your Sterling B2B Integrator installation, run deployStandards.cmd. Include the paths to the new standards database installer files on the disc. You must include both files and specify the EDI file first, followed by the CII file, as shown in the following example for Sterling B2B Integration version 5.0 and higher: \install\_dir\si\bin\deployStandards.cmd DVD\_DRIVE:\SI\SI\STERLINGIntegratorStandards.exe DVD\_DRIVE:\CII\GentranCIIStandards.exe where: DVD\_DRIVE is the letter of the drive where the disc is located. For Gentran Integration Suite version 4.x and higher, you will also include both files and specify the EDI file first, followed by the CII file, as shown in the following example: \install\_dir\si\bin\deployStandards.cmd DVD\_DRIVE:\SI\gis4x\STERLINGIntegratorStandards.exe DVD\_DRIVE:\CII\GentranCIIStandards.exe where: DVD\_DRIVE is the letter of the drive where the disc is located. Running this executable deploys the updated standards to your server.
- 4. Deploy the new standards to your client machines by following these instructions "Updating Sterling B2B Integrator Client Machines."

## Installing the Standards Databases with Sterling B2B Integrator (UNIX Server)

#### About this task

To install the Sterling Standards Database for EDI and Sterling Standards Database for CII on a Sterling B2B Integrator UNIX server:

#### **Procedure**

- 1. Place the Standards Database disc in the appropriate drive.
- Change directory to the bin subdirectory of your Sterling B2B Integrator installation.
- 3. From the bin directory of your Sterling B2B Integrator installation, run deployStandards.sh. Include the paths to the new standards database installer files on the disc. You must include both files and specify the EDI file first, followed by the CII file, as shown in the following example for Sterling B2B Integration version 5.0 and higher: \install\_dir\si\bin\deployStandards.sh DVD\_DRIVE:\SI\SI\STERLINGIntegratorStandards.exe DVD\_DRIVE:\CII\ GentranCIIStandards.exe where: DVD\_DRIVE is the letter of the drive where the disc is located. Running this executable deploys the updated standards to your server.
- 4. Deploy the new standards to your client machines by following these instructions: "Updating Sterling B2B Integrator Client Machines."

### **Updating Sterling B2B Integrator Client Machines**

After you have installed the standards databases on a Sterling B2B Integrator UNIX or Windows server, deploy the new standards to client systems by using the **Download EDI Standards** and **Download CII Standards** options from the **Deployment > Standards** menu of the Sterling B2B Integrator user interface.
