Setup Checklist – Sterling B2B Integrator Map Editor

This document contains information to assist you when planning to install the Sterling B2B Integrator Map Editor.

Key Terms

The following terms and definitions will assist you in understanding the concepts of mapping discussed in this document:

- Translation When you have an electronic document in one format and the document is needed in a different format, you must translate the data in your document from one format to another.
- Mapping To translate data from one format to another, you must specify how
 the data in one format relates to data in another format. In the Sterling B2B
 Integrator, to relate one format to another for the translator, you must define a
 set of instructions in the Sterling B2B Integrator Map Editor. These instructions
 indicate the relationship between the two formats.
- Sterling B2B Integrator Map Editor A standalone Windows program that you download from Sterling B2B Integrator. The Sterling B2B Integrator Map Editor enables you to create maps in .mxl or .map format and compile them into either translation objects (.txo files) or XML encoder objects (.ltx files), which are then used to translate documents.

Checklist for Sterling B2B Integrator Map Editor Setup

This checklist contains the items you need to gather and tasks you need to complete prior to installing the Sterling B2B Integrator Map Editor.

1	Install Sterling B2B Integrator.	
2	Determine the Sterling B2B Integrator client or client machines on which you will install the Sterling B2B Integrator Map Editor. If Sterling B2B Integrator server uses Windows, you can also install Sterling B2B Integrator Map Editor on the server.	
3	Ensure that you have the Microsoft XML Core Services (MSXML) 4.0 installed on the same computer as the Map Editor. If you do not have the Microsoft XML Core Services (MSXML) 4.0 installed, the Sterling B2B Integrator Map Editor cannot support .mxl source files.	
4	Check the Sterling B2B Integrator Map Editor System Requirements to ensure that you are using the required hardware and software.	

Installing the Sterling B2B Integrator Map Editor

The Sterling B2B Integrator Map Editor can be downloaded after Sterling B2B Integrator is installed.

About this task

Before you install and run the Sterling B2B Integrator Map Editor, ensure that you meet the requirements listed in the *Sterling B2B Integrator Map Editor System Requirements* and in the "Checklist for Sterling B2B Integrator Map Editor Setup" on page 1.

To download and install the Sterling B2B Integrator Map Editor:

Procedure

- 1. From the **Deployment** menu, select **Maps**.
- 2. In the Download and Install section next to Download Sterling B2B Integrator Map Editor, click **Go!**
- 3. Click **Save** to save the executable file.
- 4. Double-click the MapEditorInstall.exe file.
- 5. Click **Run** to start the installation.
- 6. You are prompted to choose the setup language (that is, the language in which the installation instructions will be given and in which the Sterling B2B Integrator Map Editor program will be started). Select the setup language and click **Next**.

Note: The Sterling B2B Integrator Map Editor installation program and user interface are available in the following languages: English, French, German, Italian, Japanese, Korean, Portuguese (Brazil), Spanish, Simplified Chinese (China), and Traditional Chinese (Taiwan).

Note: If you have already installed Sterling B2B Integrator Map Editor and have not uninstalled it prior to running the installation program to upgrade to a new version, you will not be prompted to choose a Setup Language for install unless you first uninstall the prior version of Sterling B2B Integrator Map Editor. You do, however, have the option to select or change the language in which Sterling B2B Integrator Map Editor will be run from the **Options > Language** menu.

- 7. In the Setup Welcome window, click Next.
- 8. In the Choose Destination Location window, select where you want to install the Sterling B2B Integrator Map Editor:
 - If you accept the default location, click Next.
 - If you want to specify a different location, click **Browse**, specify the path to the folder, click **OK**, and click **Next**.

Note: Use this option if your network administrator does not allow running local applications in Administrator mode. You need to select a location other than the default to install the Map Editor, for example, C:\MapEditor. If the folder does not yet exist, you are asked if you want to create that folder.

Note: If you already installed the Map Editor in the Program Files (86) directory, and need to change the user level to a lower privilege, go to the Mapper Manifest file and change level="highestAvailable" to the following value:

- 9. In the Select Program Folder window, specify the program folder where you want the Sterling B2B Integrator Map Editor to be located.
 - If you accept the default folder, click **Next**.
 - If you want to specify a different folder, type a new name in place of IBM® Sterling B2B Integrator Map Editor or select a folder from the Existing Folders list, and click Next.

The Sterling B2B Integrator Map Editor setup wizard installs the Sterling B2B Integrator Map Editor.

10. In the Setup Complete window, click Finish.
