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Chapter 1. Introduction to Channel Applications Manager

This guide explains how to configure IBM® Sterling Call Center, IBM Sterling Store, and IBM Sterling Field Sales applications using the rules provided in the Channel Applications Manager, based on your business requirement.

Important: It is assumed that you are familiar with the concepts and business functionality explained in the corresponding application's Concepts Guide.

You can configure the following applications using the Channel Applications Manager:

- IBM Sterling Call Center
- IBM Sterling Store
- IBM Sterling Field Sales

Note:

- It is recommended that you adjust the Java Console memory parameters based on your data set and usage in order to avoid runtime exceptions.
- One of the configurations that you can perform is specifying the time limit for which a user can remain logged in to the IBM Sterling Call Center and IBM Sterling Store application. The time-out parameters can be defined in the application server.

Understanding Channel Applications Manager Layout

The Channel Applications Manager is a graphical user interface that you can use to configure different aspects of the IBM Sterling Selling and Fulfillment Foundation. The different configurations are defined by logical groupings that can be accessed from the Channel Applications Manager's main screen.

Each logical grouping focuses on a particular aspect of the Channel Applications Manager and contains rules, common codes, and settings necessary for the applications to work in a real-world business setting.

The Channel Applications Manager displays groupings by way of an information tree. To expand each grouping, click the **Expand** icon located next to the group's name. When a group expands, each specific configuration associated with that group is displayed.

Next to each specific configuration, there is an icon, which indicates the user as to the progress of the configuration. When the cursor is placed over the icon, the current status of the configuration is displayed in a pop-up window.

The following table describes the different icons used in the Channel Applications Manager.

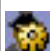

When you select a group that you want to configure, the Channel Applications Manager tree expands to display the available configuration rules for the selected group. Select a configuration that is not yet completed or still in progress. For certain configurations, under applications you can tweak some advanced configurations. To tweak these advanced configurations, select the Advanced Configuration hyperlink.

To view and change the configurations for a different enterprise organization, click the Load Configuration For Enterprise hyperlink. An organization may not be able to modify all the rules within the Channel Applications Manager based on the ownership of the individual configurations. For example, the installation level rules can be only modified by the Hub organization. Additionally, one Enterprise organization may inherit rules from another Enterprise. In such situations, the configuration can be only modified by the Enterprise that owns the organization, and not by the Enterprise that inherits the configuration. If the organization inherits a configuration from another organization, a hyperlink is displayed next to the configuration's name enabling the user to override the ownership of that configuration. If the organization has previously overridden the ownership, a hyperlink is displayed next to the configuration's name enabling the user to provide ownership back to the organization from where it was originally inheriting.

Chapter 2. Configure IBM Sterling Call Center and IBM Sterling Store

Configuring Initial System Setup for IBM Sterling Call Center and IBM Sterling Store

An advanced system setup enables you to configure system-wide elements such as locales and units of measure. These rules are typically configured once during the start of an implementation.

Configuring an Enterprise Profile

An Enterprise represents the organization that owns and controls all the transactions. An Enterprise controls the flow of documents, such as a sales order, and is considered the owner of the document. Most business rules and fulfillment processes for an order are defined by the Enterprise. On a sales order, the Enterprise is also assigned the role of the Seller organization in most cases. However, in some cases, if a higher level organizational unit wants to control and enforce business rules or document flow of all its subsidiaries, that organizational unit is assigned an Enterprise role and its subsidiary organizations are assigned Seller and Buyer roles.

Even though most business rules are controlled by the Enterprise, pricing rules are always controlled by the Seller organization in both sales and purchase situations. For more information about defining enterprise attributes, see the *Sterling Selling and Fulfillment Foundation: Configuration Guide*.

If implementing an enterprise to be used by the IBM Sterling Selling and Fulfillment Foundation integration, the Account with Hub attribute must be populated with the IBM Sterling Selling and Fulfillment Foundation application's StoreFront skin name. This is used when punching out to the IBM Sterling Selling and Fulfillment Foundation application from within the IBM Sterling Call Center and IBM Sterling Store applications.

Managing Supply Chain Network Model

You can define participants of the supply chain model such as shipping nodes, carriers, vendors, etc. You can use this configuration to determine sourcing decisions.

Managing Products and Categories

You can define your complete catalog of product items including items, categories, and classifications. Use this configuration when the product items are maintained within the IBM Sterling Selling and Fulfillment Foundation.

Configuring Delivery and Installation

In addition to shipped products, you can manage the execution of delivery services and provided services.

Delivery Services are billable services that are directly associated with a product on a sales order or a return order. For example, the delivery of a high-definition television.

Provided Services are billable services that are offered to enhance the life or usability of a product associated with a sales order. For example, the application of fabric protection on a sofa or installation service for a home theater system.

Delivery Services and provided services are also defined as items by the Catalog Organization and are available to all organizations that share that Catalog Organization.

Defining Customers

This configuration allows you to define B2B customers and consumers. These customers and consumers place orders with your business. This configuration provides additional information about the customers such as their appointment slot preferences, additional contact information, and answers to address questions, and so on.

Configuring Order Promising Rules

This configuration defines the rules for making accurate customer order promises. It enables you to set up rules that control from where and when you ship a product. Sourcing rules provide you with control parameters at product, geography, order, and customer level so that the appropriate sourcing nodes are selected for fulfilling customers demand.

Configuring Payment Handling

This configuration enables you to define payment types that the application can accept and rules that control how the payments are processed in the system. This configuration also enables you to integrate with external payment processing systems such as CyberSource® or Chase™ Paymentech. Payment processing involves payment authorization, settlement, and invoicing.

Configuring Order Administration

Once an order is captured it needs to be modified at various points throughout its life-cycle. For example, the customers may decide to have their order shipped to their work address instead of their home address, or a payment method that was declined could be replaced with another method. Also, if an order encounters a processing error, a CSR Lead may need to give a credit to a customer in order to keep the customer satisfied.

IBM Sterling Call Center and IBM Sterling Store understands the typical modifications that are frequently made to the orders, and provides a task-based call center user interface to perform these modifications.

You can also configure rules to control how and when modifications can be performed.

Configuring Store Pick Up Administration

This configuration enables you to indicate if your enterprise allows store pick up.

Configuring Outbound Logistics

This configuration enables you to define carriers and rules that control outbound logistics including carrier services and shipment modes. You can accept, store, and manage the execution of a delivery plan accounting for complex, multi-step, multi-leg, and multi-mode movement of goods, including practices such as merge-in-transit, continuous movement, lane optimization and cross-docking. All activities among all parties are coordinated in the delivery chain, and events are proactively monitored and notified participants when deviations occur. Shipment and delivery records are tied to the original sales or purchase orders for management of dependencies among orders and shipments. Post-delivery reconciliation of performance, comparing actual with promised, SLA metric analysis, participant performance, and so on is provided.

Configuring Business Process Models and Monitoring Rules

The life-cycle of an order is long and complex. It starts with accurately capturing the customer's order into a system and then accurately fulfilling the order through delivery. After the customer receives their shipment, the order may need to be returned and the merchandise inspected to determine whether or not it can be repaired and placed back into inventory.

Orders go through a wide range of statuses throughout their fulfillment cycles. Orders are processed by transactions that perform modifications to the orders and their related entities such as shipments, invoices, and returns. These transactions also determine how an order moves from one status to the next. Additionally, an order in a particular status can go through a condition to determine which transaction should process it next.

An order's flow throughout its fulfillment cycle is represented graphically by a pipeline. The pipeline determines the statuses that an order can be in, which transactions process it, and which conditions it must go through in order to be fulfilled.

Configuring Inventory Synchronization

When promising orders to customers, it can be challenging to offer them an exact inventory picture across all nodes. The inventory that is used to promise orders is not necessarily on-hand. It could be in transit or a purchase order could have just been placed and the retailer may feel comfortable with using a certain percentage of that future supply to fulfill the future demand.

Configuring Return Administration

You can define the rules that control how returns can be modified and validated. Condition-based returns processing, including execution and management of associated processes, such as exchange orders, refurbishment and repair requests, and return disposition are delivered. With chained order capability, multiple returns can be linked or requests can be repaired to original sales orders, providing repair life-cycle tracking. Managing reverse inventory tracking back to the appropriate node based upon appropriate business rules is provided. You can handle return receipts, disposition, and initiate the crediting process.

Configuring Alert Management

Fully integrated event configuration, status and event monitoring, and alert handling capabilities are provided. The underlying mechanism for setting and monitoring conditions or events that drive transactional activity within the critical supply chain processes such as fulfillment, inventory management, and purchasing is also provided. The event engine enables processes to be modeled and managed based upon events occurring rather than within a pre-defined, hard-coded application procedure. Exceptions can be handled automatically as well as through configurable exception consoles with full tracking, automatic escalation and resolution with complete audit history.

Configuring User Security

This configuration provides the capability to ensure that each user accesses only the information that is appropriate for carrying out their tasks. A user is limited to access only those resources to which they have permission.

Configuring System Administration for IBM Sterling Call Center and IBM Sterling Store

The System Management module provides the following capabilities:

- Enables you to manage integration and agent servers, view the properties of your application servers, enable database caching, and increase trace log output for APIs, user exits, services, and agents.
- Provides features to administer and monitor various components.
- Provides a complete picture of IBM Sterling Call Center and IBM Sterling Store while it is running. Additionally, the health monitor agent can alert system administrators when a problem happens such as an application server going down or an agent server not processing tasks.

Extending and Customizing the Application

You can extend and customize the application by creating new user interface resources, menus, themes, custom common codes, and customer error codes to meet your specific business needs.

Configuring Store-Specific Tasks

This configuration enables you to configure all the specific tasks of a store belonging to this enterprise.

Chapter 3. Configure the IBM Sterling Field Sales Application

Configuring Initial System Setup for IBM Sterling Field Sales Application

An advanced system setup has been provided that allows you to configure system-wide elements such as locales and units of measure. These will typically be configured once during the start of an implementation.

Configuring an Enterprise Profile

You can define your company profile and basic rules that guide how the application operates. An Enterprise represents the organization that owns and controls all the transactions. An Enterprise controls the flow of documents and is considered the owner of the document.

Managing Supply Chain Network Model

You can capture participants in your supply chain model (such as your distribution centers, vendors, and delivery nodes). This model is used as metadata for making sourcing decisions.

Define your complete catalog of product items including items, categories, and classifications. Use this configuration when the product items are maintained within the IBM Sterling Selling and Fulfillment Suite.

You can configure the following rules as part of this configuration

- Configure Units of Measure
- Manage Products
- Define Types of Product Classifications
- Define Classification Values
- Define Association Types for an Item

Defining Customers

This configuration enables you to define B2B customers and consumers. These customers and consumers place orders with your business. This configuration provides additional information about the customers such as their appointment slot preferences, additional contact information, and answers to address questions.

Configuring Payment Handling

This configuration enables you to define payment types that the application can accept and rules that control how the payments are processed in the system.

Configuring Quote Administration

You can configure rules as part of this configuration to modify and validate quotes.

Configuring Opportunity Administration

You can configure rules as part of this configuration to modify and validate opportunities

Configuring Business Process Models and Monitoring Rules

Process modeling controls business workflow and provides the flexibility to thread together business transactions in a sequence that best represents your business environment. A single order document may go through multiple types of processes such as fulfillment, payment, and so forth.

Configuring User Security

You can configure rules for User Security as part of this configuration

System Administration for IBM Sterling Field Sales Application

You can define the components required for daily maintenance and monitoring of the application including purge criteria, user exits, and health monitor rules.

Configuring Change Project Management

Many users implement new features or database changes as separate projects. A Change Project provides the mechanism to consolidate database changes as a single unit and is a collection of smaller tasks called "Change Requests". Change Project Management allows users to implement the database changes on a staging or a testing environment before implementing them on a production environment.

The Change Project Management module allows you to configure the following:

- Change Project Rules
- Change Requests

Note:

You can use the Change Project Management configuration feature only after you have configured your enterprise profile. Refer to the topic *Configuring an Enterprise Profile* for details on configuring an enterprise.

Define Change Project Rules



Each installation or deployment must define its own project rules for Change Projects in the system.

You can define the following project rules from the Change Project Rules screen.

- Entity locking level
- Synchronization time at which the Change Projects must be exported.

Set Entity Locking Level



The entity lock level can be set at either Change Request or Change Project level. Multiple designated users can work on a Change Project simultaneously, however, a user can work only on one Change Request at a time. In such a scenario, changes being made to a Change Request for a Change Project are locked so that other users cannot override the changes for the same project. The default locking level is Change Request.

- To set the entity locking level, perform the following steps:
 1. In the Channel Applications Manager, click  adjacent to Change Project Management to expand the branch.
 2. Select Define Change Project Rules.
 3. The Change Project Rules screen is displayed.
 4. Select the level at which the changes must be locked from the **Level At Which Changes Should Be Locked** drop-down list.
 5. Click .

Set a Sync Time

A Change Project is published on the production environment when a sync time is set, which is defined by the enterprise.




To set a sync time, perform the following steps:

1. In the Channel Applications Manager, click  adjacent to Change Project Management to expand the branch.
2. Select Define Change Project Rules.
3. The Change Project Rules screen is displayed.
4. Enter a time (HH:MM format) in the **Change Project is Available For Synchronization At** text box.
5. Click .



Manage Change Requests

Use the Manage Change Requests module in the Channel Applications Manager to manage Change Requests. The Change Requests screen allows you to view a list of change requests assigned to the current logged in user, view the details of a Change Request or mark a Change Request as complete.

To view Change Requests, perform the following steps:

1. In the Channel Applications Manager, click  adjacent to Change Project Management to expand the branch.
2. Select Manage Change Requests.
3. The Change Requests screen is displayed with a list of available Change Requests along with their status.
4. Select a Change Request from the list.
5. After you select a Change Request, you can do one of the following operations:
6. Click  to view the details of the Change Request. The Change Request Details dialog box is displayed with the Change Request details such as Change Request ID, Change Project ID, Status, Short and Long Descriptions.
7. Click  to mark a Change Request as complete.

Note: Only Change Requests that are in "Work in Progress" status can be marked complete.

8. Click  to mark a Change Request as "Work in progress" for the logged in user.
9. Click  to remove the Change Request from "Work in progress" status for the logged in user.

Note:

The Change Request status does not change to "Open".
