

- "In-place upgrade" (now has new, multiple names)
- Migration Wizard
- Server Consolidation



Upgrade/Migration what tools are available?

Local Upgrade (In-Place Upgrade)

The Local Upgrade updates the NOS on a single machine, the same piece of hardware gets a new OS.

Migration Wizard

The Migration Wizard takes the identity, DS and all data and moves it to a new piece of hardware. It is an across the wire hardware "swap" utility.

Server Consolidation Utility

The Server Consolidation Utility moved user data, along with all associated meta-data. It can now move files across trees. Copies are non-destructive (source data remains in tact).

Remote Upgrade

The Remote upgrade will allow administrators to upgrade any server in their environment, regardless of location from a centralize location.

Deployment Manager

The Deployment Manager is a tool that prepares your network for the introduction of a new server.

Down Server Upgrade

The ability to restore a non-responding server from a down state by using the Install CD and restoring basic operating system files...also allows you to upgrade at that time.

Upgrade/Migration common pitfalls

IP Infrastructure not in place

Failure to allow DS to synchronize

Not cleaning up eDirectory problems first

Not enough free space on SYS volume

Running RCONSOLE from the server you are upgrading

Having applications that hold eDirectory open

Failure to communicate plan to team members

Have a human onsite at remote locations

uh...do you have a backup?





Upgrade/Migration do this first!

If you are going to do any of these items, do them before you upgrade the server:



Change server names

Change server context in eDirectory

Change server IP addresses



Upgrade/Migration clusters

Web based deployment manager

- Launch cluster install and upgrade tools
 - Requires Novell client on desktop

Upgrade from NW5.1 to NW6.5

Same procedure as NW5.1 to NW6

Upgrade from NW6 to NW6.5

- Rolling server upgrade is supported
 - Upgrade each server in turn
- Cluster operational during upgrade




Server Consolidation Utility features

Server Consolidation Features

- Many to one
- One to many
- Same eDir tree
- Different eDir trees
- Copies all data
 - Trustees/ownerships/namespace information





Server Consolidation Utility copy file data

File system

- All stream data
- All meta-data
 - Trustees
 - Ownerships
 - User space restrictions
 - Name space information (Macintosh)





Server Consolidation Utility copy directory data

Match-up objects

Must be trustees

Can create

- Users
- Groups

Trick

 One dummy group for users or groups not assigned as trustees



Server Consolidation Utility bells & whistles

File synchronization

Delete on destination if deleted on source

File comparison

- · Compare meta-data
 - Trustees/ownerships/date/time/size
- Compare all file information
 - Byte-by-byte comparison
 - First difference stops compare





Server Consolidation Utility

more bells & whistles

Date ranges

Last accessed/modified/created dates

Wildcard list

- Exlusion list
 - *.mp3
 - *.bak
 - Specific.file



Server Consolidation Utility command line options

Scheduled tasks

- Program/Accessories/System Tools/Scheduled Tasks
- Add scheduled task
- Follow wizard
 - Enter project name
 - The letter Y, to automatically run the selected Server Consolidation project.
 - The password for the admin on the source server.
 - The password for the admin on the destination server

Server Consolidation Utility other features

Microsoft Active Directory to NetWare

Similar to NT to NetWare

- Users
- Groups
- File system including permissions
- Containers (users and groups only)



Services Consolidation / Migration Utility (SCMU)


- Multiple sources/destinations
