

#### About this task


- The Apache Cordova Showcase delivers a sample that demonstrates how the Cordova APIs are used and how Cordova can be combined with Dojo to produce effective applications
- It is similar to the test application that is shipped as part of Cordova, but includes an improved look and feel which uses Dojo Mobile, resulting in an application with a layout similar to the Dojo Showcase
- The code is available within this release as an Eclipse project for Android and as an Xcode project for iOS



#### About this task

- The Apache Cordova Showcase works in two modes:
  - Single-column for devices with small screens
  - Two-column for devices with relatively large screens

- The Android and iOS versions of the Apache Cordova Showcase have the same structure
- The following workflow is common to both versions when running the demo:
  - Load the Apache Cordova Showcase
    - The scrollable demo menu is displayed
      - Switched to the demo view in single-column mode
      - Displayed in the right column in two-column mode
  - Scroll the demo menu and click the demo item
    - The demo is loaded
  - Run the demo
    - Follow the instructions that are provided in Explore the demos



- Click Source to display the source view
  - Click the HTML tab to see the HTML template of the demo







- Click the JavaScript tab to see the corresponding JavaScript code for the demo
  - Note that not all demos have JavaScript code

- Click **Demo** to return to the demo view
  - In single-column mode, you can also click Back
- Select another demo from the demo menu
  - In single-column mode, click **Back** to return to the demo menu and pick other demos
  - In two-column mode, you can directly click items in the demo menu to jump to different demos



#### Known limitations

There are some known limitations in this Showcase. The following instructions describe how to implement workarounds to these limitations:

- Zooming on Android tablets
  - On Android 3.0+ tablets, the Showcase is automatically zoomed which gives a poor user experience
  - To disable zooming, perform the following steps to set the SDK version to 11 or above:
    - Right-click the generated Android project and then Properties



- Click Android in the properties list
- Change Project Build Target to Android 3.0 or above and click OK
- Edit AndroidManifest.xml in the root of the generated project
  - Set android:minSdkVersion to the API level of the Project Build Target

#### Known limitations

- Enable Showcase features
  - Edit AndroidManifest.xml in the root of the generated project
    - Add the following permission elements:

<pre><uses-permission android:name="android.permission.CAMERA"></uses-permission></pre>	Allows access to the camera device
<pre><uses-permission android:name="android.permission.VIBRATE"></uses-permission></pre>	Allows access to the device vibrator
<pre><uses-permission android:name="android.permission.ACCESS_COARSE_LOCATION"></uses-permission></pre>	Allows access to a coarse location such as Cell-ID or WiFi
<pre><uses-permission android:name="android.permission.ACCESS_FINE_LOCATION"></uses-permission></pre>	Allows access to a fine location such as GPS
<pre><uses-permission android:name="android.permission.ACCESS_LOCATION_EXTRA_COMMANDS"></uses-permission></pre>	Allows access to extra location provider commands
<pre><uses-permission android:name="android.permission.READ_PHONE_STATE"></uses-permission></pre>	Allows read only access to phone state
<pre><uses-permission android:name="android.permission.INTERNET"></uses-permission></pre>	Allows network sockets to be opened







  - Local Audio
    - Click Play/Unpause Local Audio to hear speech play
    - Click Pause Playing Audio to pause the speech
    - Click Play/Unpause Local Audio again to resume play
    - Click Stop Playing Audio to stop play

- Audio Play/Record
  - Recorded Audio
    - Click Record Audio for 10 seconds to start recording
      - Notification beep may be heard
      - Status set to Running
    - Talk into the microphone for 10 seconds
      - Notification beep sounds again
      - Status set to Stopped
    - Click Play/Unpause Recorded Audio to play back recorded audio
    - Click Pause Playing Audio to pause playback
    - Click Play/Unpause Local Audio again to resume play






- Camera
  - Click **Take Picture** to switch to your camera application
  - Take and save a picture
    - Control returns to the demo
    - Picture image is displayed
    - Status set to Success
  - Click Select Image from Library to switch to your image library application
  - Select an image
    - Control returns to the demo
    - Selected image is displayed
    - Status set to Success





- Compass
  - Click Get Compass Heading to populate Heading attribute with current compass heading
  - Click Start Watching Compass
    - Status set to Watching
    - Heading value continuously updates as device changes direction
  - Click Stop Watching Compass
    - Status set to Stopped
    - Heading value stops updating






- Contacts
  - Click Get phone's contacts to display a list of contacts in your device





- Events
  - Click Intercept 'back' button to intercept Back button clicks, then click Back on your device
    - Message 'Back button intercepted' is displayed
  - Click Stop intercepting 'back' button to switch intercept off
  - Click Intercept 'menu' button to intercept Menu button clicks, then click Menu on your device
    - Message 'Menu button intercepted' is displayed
  - Click Stop intercepting 'menu' to switch intercept off






- Events
  - Click Intercept 'search' button to intercept Search button clicks, then click Search on your device
    - Message 'Search button intercepted' is displayed
  - Click Stop intercepting 'search' to switch intercept off





- Location\*
  - Click Get Location to populate Latitude and Longitude attributes with current location
  - Click Start Watching Location
    - Status set to Watching
    - Latitude and Longitude values continuously update as device moves
  - Click Stop Watching Location
    - Status set to Stopped
    - Latitude and Longitude values stop updating

- Local Storage
  - Note the value of the counter that is displayed in the message
  - Exit the Showcase, restart it, and reselect Local Storage
  - Check that the counter is incremented by one
    - The counter does not increment simply by leaving this view and coming back; you must exit the Showcase






- Miscellaneous content
  - Click Call 911 to initiate a call to 911 (emergency assistance in the US and Canada)
    - If your device is not call-enabled, an error message is displayed
  - Click Send Mail to switch to your mail application
    - To:, Subject:, and Body fields are pre-populated with test data
  - Click Send SMS to switch to your SMS application
  - Click Load Web Page to switch to your browser application
  - Click Map IBM HQ to switch to Google Maps and locate IBM HQ
  - Click Search Android Market to switch to the Android Market application
  - Click View Image App to switch to your image viewing and manipulation application
    - Note: This feature is not supported on Android 3.x devices





- Notification/Dialogs
  - Click Beep to cause your device to beep
  - Click Vibrate to cause your device to vibrate, if the device is capable





#### **Known limitations**

There are some known limitations in this Showcase. The following instructions describe how to implement workarounds to these limitations:

- Importing a Worklight® project
  - The import window does not close when importing an existing project into the workspace for the first time
  - This behavior is a known Eclipse defect
    - https://bugs.eclipse.org/bugs/show\_bug.cgi?id=337913
  - To resolve this situation, perform the following steps:
    - Exit the Worklight Studio
      - Right-click the Eclipse icon and then Close
    - Restart the Worklight Studio
    - Delete the partially imported project from the workspace
    - Import the project again
      - The project is successfully imported





#### Known limitations

Screen rotation

- Apache Cordova disables screen rotation by default
- To enable free rotation, perform the following step:
  - Edit CDVMainViewController.m
    - Update method shouldAutorotateToInterfaceOrientation to always return YES in the generated native Xcode project

- (BOOL) shouldAutorotateToInterfaceOrientation: (UIInterfaceOrientation) interfaceOrientation
{
    // Return YES for supported orientations
    return (interfaceOrientation == YES);
}
```


