

Overview

- Adapter is a server-side entity.
- Adapters are implemented in JavaScript™
- Use the adapter to perform some complex functions; for example, encrypting and decrypting data, or generating and validating security tokens.
- Where JavaScript is not enough to implement these functions, or a Java class exists, it is possible to use Java code in your adapter.
- Important The Java[™] code is an extension of the adapter function and not a replacement.

Adding custom Java classes to your project

- To use an existing Java library, add the JAR file to the server\lib folder of your Worklight® Project.
- After the Worklight Adapter is built and deployed, this JAR file is automatically deployed to a Worklight server.





Adding custom Java classes to your project

- To add custom Java code to your project, right-click the server/java folder in your Worklight project and add a Java class file. Name it Calculator1.java.
- Important package name must start with com.

Add this file to a package. In this sample, the



Adding custom Java classes to your project

- Add two methods to your Calculator1.java class
 - Static method; does not require a new instance of a class
 - Instance method

```
package com.worklight.customcode;

public class Calculator1 {

    public static int addTwoIntegers(int first, int second){
        return first + second;
    }

    public int subtractTwoIntegers(int first, int second){
        return first - second;
    }
}
```

 If your Java code has additional dependencies, put the required JARs in the server\lib folder of your Worklight project

Invoking custom Java classes from the adapter (1 of 2)

 After your custom Java code is created and any required JAR files added, you can reference it from your Worklight Adapter JavaScript as if it was written in Java.

```
function addTwoIntegers(a,b){
    return {
        result: com.worklight.customcode.Calculator1.addTwoIntegers(a,b)
    };
}

function subtractTwoIntegers(a,b){
    var calcInstance = new com.worklight.customcode.Calculator1();

    return {
        result : calcInstance.subtractTwoIntegers(a,b)
    };
}

Invoke the static Java method as shown, and use the full class name to reference it directly

Invoking custom Java classes from the adapter (2 of 2)

 After your custom Java code is created and any required JAR files added, you can reference it from your Worklight Adapter JavaScript as if it was written in Java

```
function addTwoIntegers(a,b){
    return {
        result: com.workli
    };
}

function subtractTwoIntegers(a,b){
    war calcInstance = new com.worklight.customcode.Calculator1();
    return {
        result : calcInstance.subtractTwoIntegers(a,b)
    };
}
```

Invoking adapter procedures from Java code (1 of 4)

You can also invoke Worklight Adapter procedures from your Java code.

```
public void callProcedure(){
    DataAccessService service = WorklightBundles.getInstance().getDataAccessService();
    String paramArray = "['param1','param2','param3']";
    ProcedureQName procedureQName = new ProcedureQName("adapterName", "procedureName");
    InvocationResult result = service.invokeProcedure(procedureQName, paramArray);
    JSONObject jsonObject = result.toJSON();
    String value = (String)jsonObject.get("key");
}
```



Invoking adapter procedures from Java code (2 of 4)

 You can also invoke Worklight Adapter procedures from your Java code.

```
public void callProcedure(){
    DataAccessService service = WorklightBundles.getInstance().getDataAccessService();
    String paramArray = "['param1','param2','param3']";
    ProcedureQName procedureQName = new ProcedureQName("adapterName", "procedureQName");
    InvocationResult result = service.invokeProcedure(procedureQName, paramArray);
    JSONObject jsonObject = result.toJSON();
    String value = (String)jsonObject.get("key");
}
```

```
public void callProcedure(){
    DataAccessService service = WorklightBundles.getInstance().getDataAccessService();
    String paramArray = "['param1','param2','param3']";
    ProcedureQName procedureQName = new ProcedureQName("adapterName", "procedureName");
    InvocationResult = service.invokeProcedure(procedureQName, paramArray);
    JSONObject jsonObject = result.toJSON();
    String value = (String)jsonObject.get("key");
}
```

Invoke the procedure and use the InvocationResult returned
