Key Trends

- Food safety is now a global problem
- Need for better traceability in supply chain

Financial Post, February 23, 2009

- Peanuts and peanut products tainted with salmonella in the U.S. have made 604 people sick, sent 187 to the hospital and killed eight. The **salmonella** also has led to many product recalls in Canada and more than 2,000 product recalls in the U.S., more than any other epidemic. To make matters worse, Peanut Corp. of America, the company at the heart of the salmonella episode, filed for bankruptcy liquidation in court recently.

- The Public Health Ministry office in Samut Sakhon has filed a lawsuit against the producer and distributor of the Chao Doy **canned fish which caused many people to fall ill** when it was distributed as part of an aid package.

Philippine Daily Inquirer, February 25, 2009, Test area for **Ebola-Reston** virus widened,

- MANILA, Philippines—Authorities have decided to widen the scope of the testing for the Ebola-Reston virus to cover the whole of Central Luzon and Calabarzon regions. The agriculture and health departments authorized the wider testing after finding that the virus was continuing to be transmitted on a farm in Pandi, Bulacan, Six thousand pigs are set to be culled within the week on the Bulacan farm while the Manaoag farm is now out of quarantine.

HANOI, Feb. 26 (Xinhua) -- **Bird flu** continues to spread wide in Vietnam with another newly-infected northern Dien Bien province, raising the number of Vietnamese provinces hit by the virus to 11, according to Vietnam's Department of Animal Health under the Ministry of Agriculture and Rural Development on Thursday.

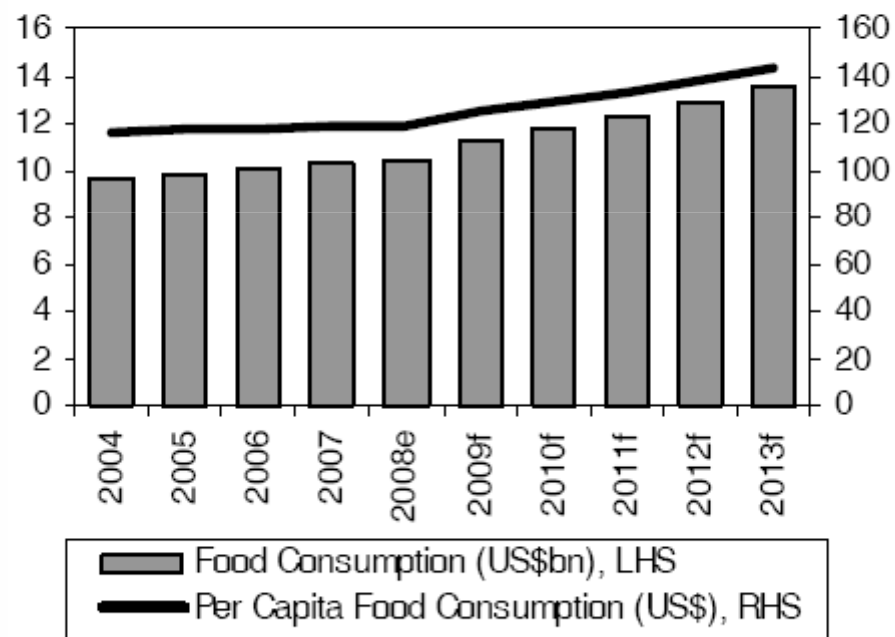
- 260 seafood-processing plants (is a major exporter)

Vietnam food consumption

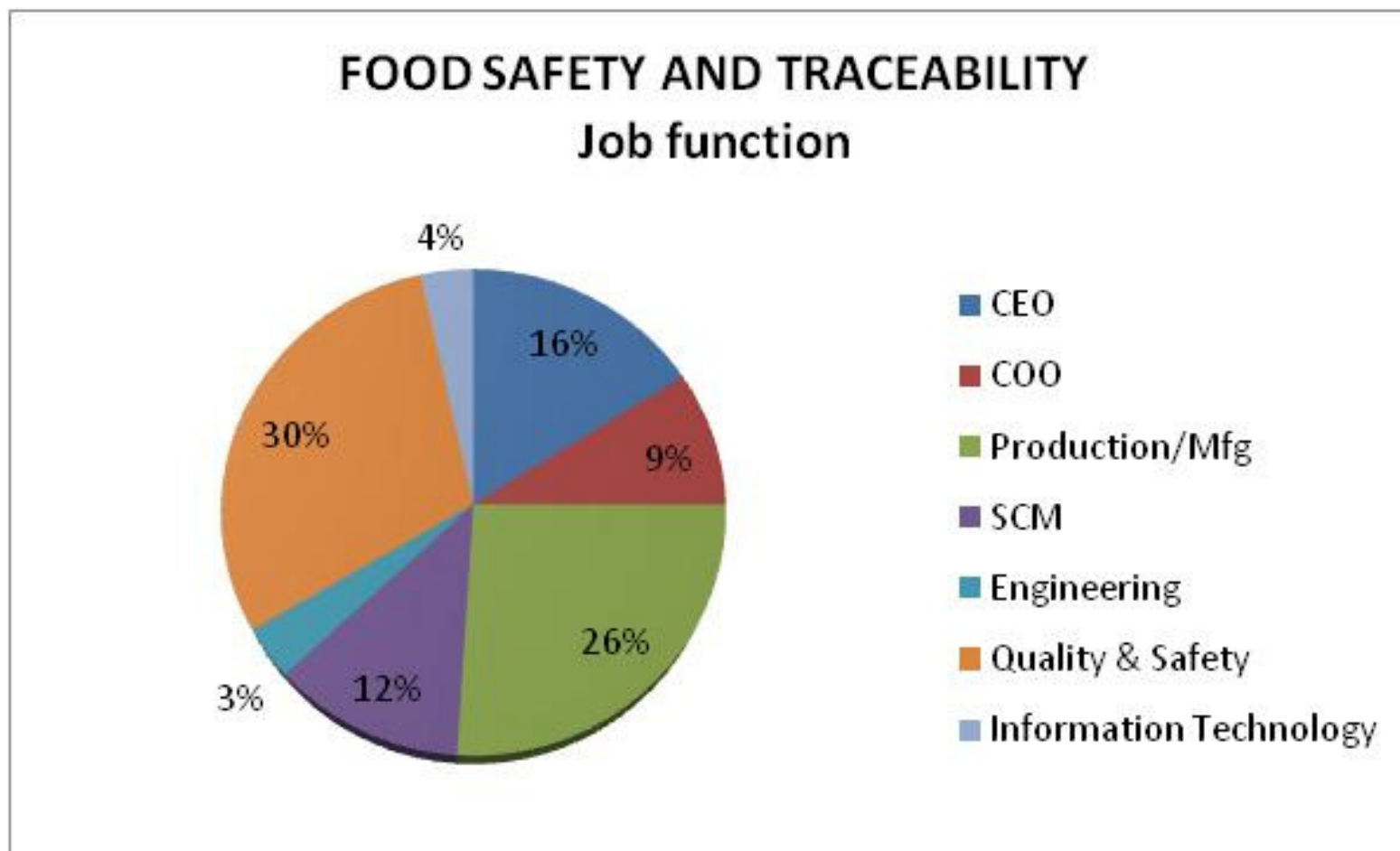

(2004-2013)



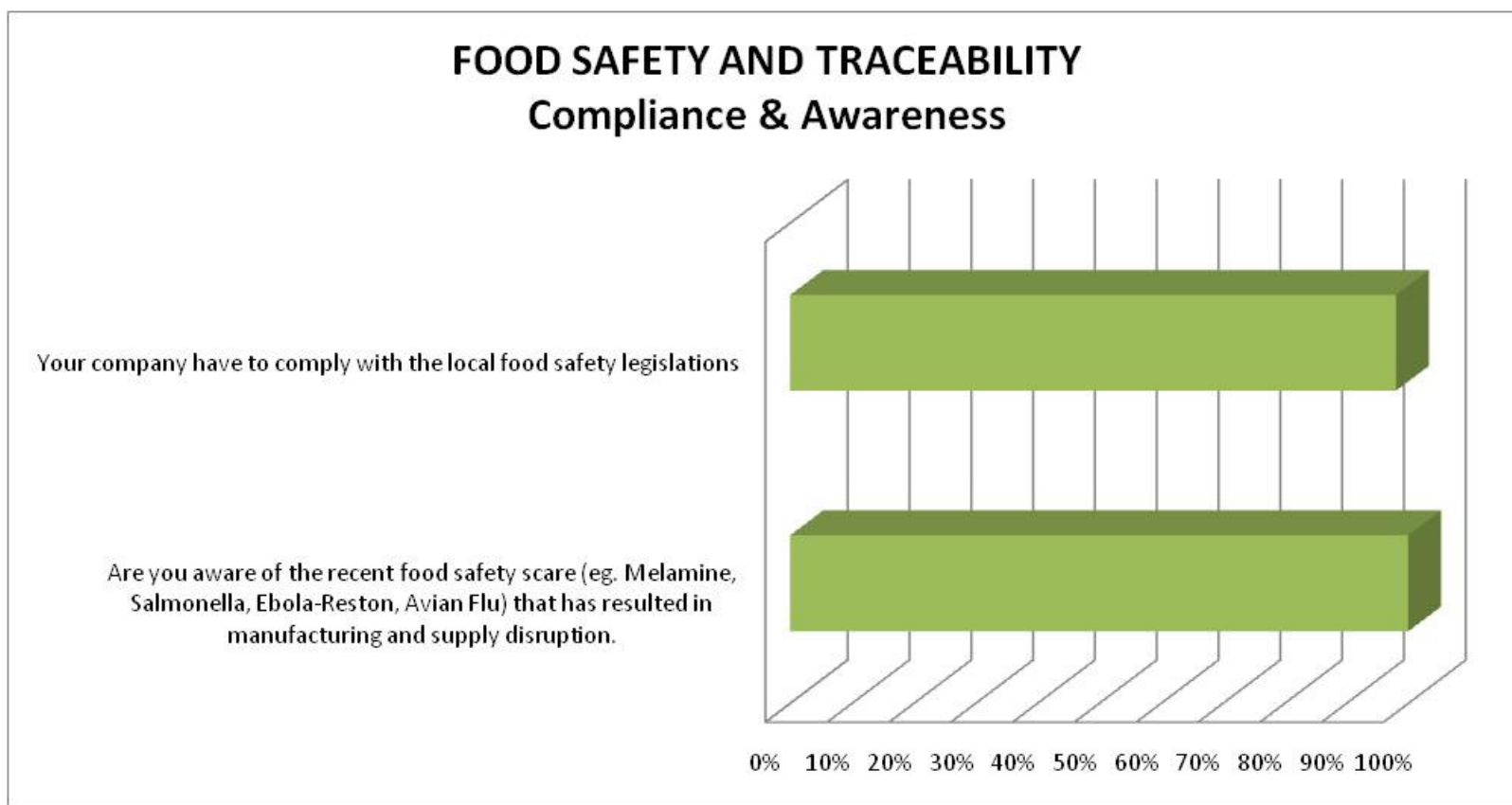

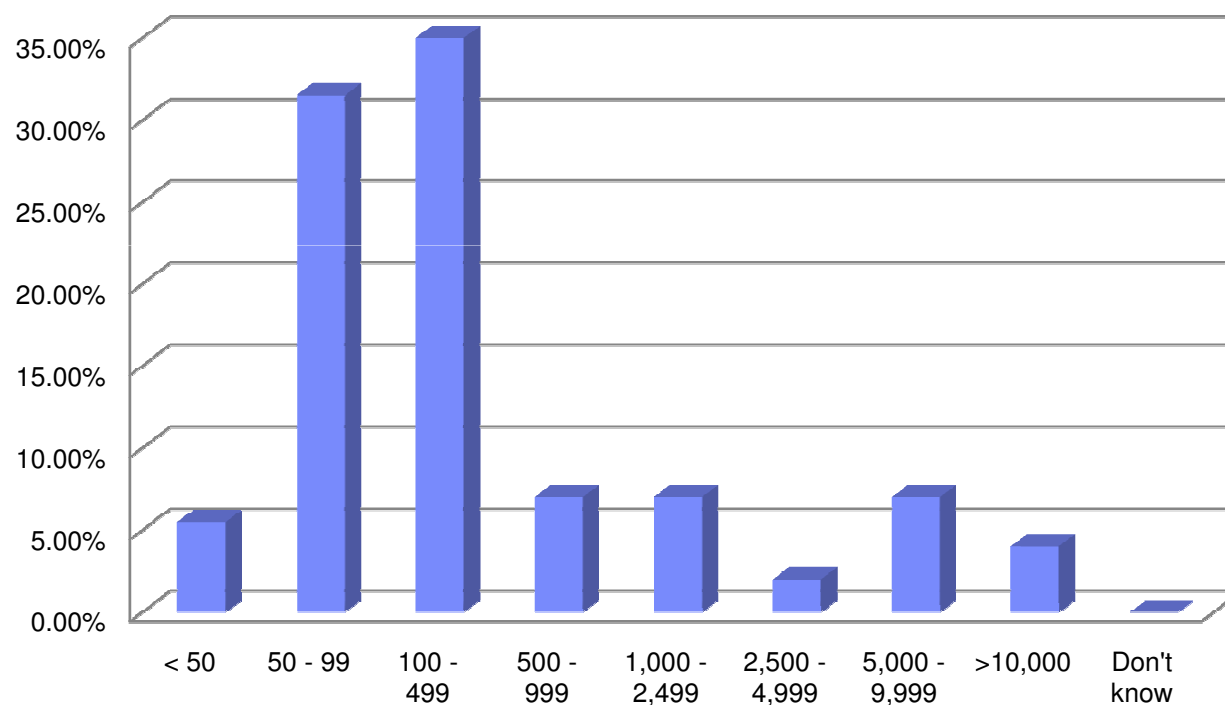
Food Safety and Traceability Survey

- Another 20% is not sure when this implementation will take place.

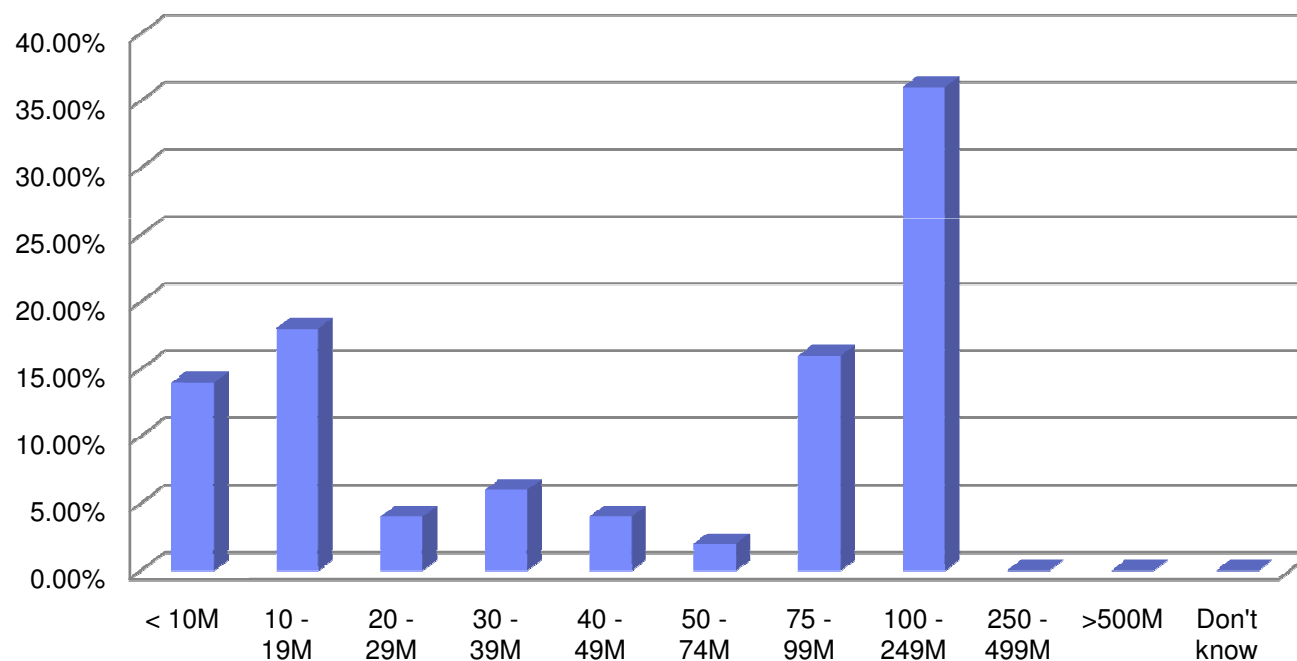

Risks

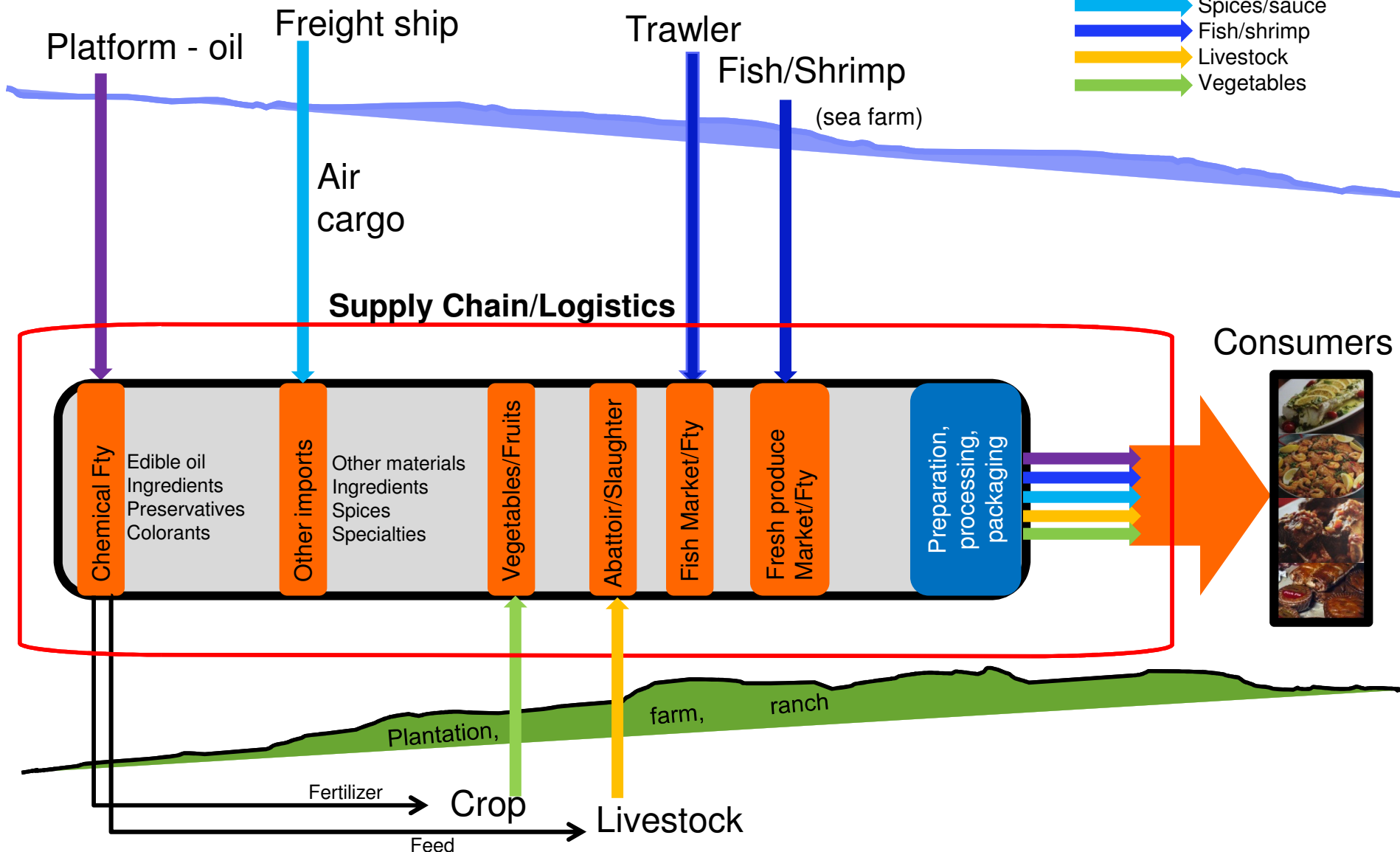
- Food recalls
 - Salmonella in peanut butter, pistachio
 - Melamine in dairy products
- Foreign Animal Disease outbreaks
 - Avian flu, Ebola Reston, e-Coli, Salmonella,
- Contamination due to long complex supply chains
- Fraudulent activities
 - Re-labeling damaged product, counterfeit products
- Threat of bioterrorism

Results

- Brand erosion
 - 66% of consumers don't trust companies to do what is best for the consumer in the event of a recall
- Customers want proof
 - Demand for "proof" of product claims and origins from consumers and retailers
- Government pressure
 - Increased pressure on governments to implement programs to protect human & animal health
- Import regulations
 - Foreign governments (ex. EU, Japan) have increased regulations requiring traceability of imported product to protect their citizens

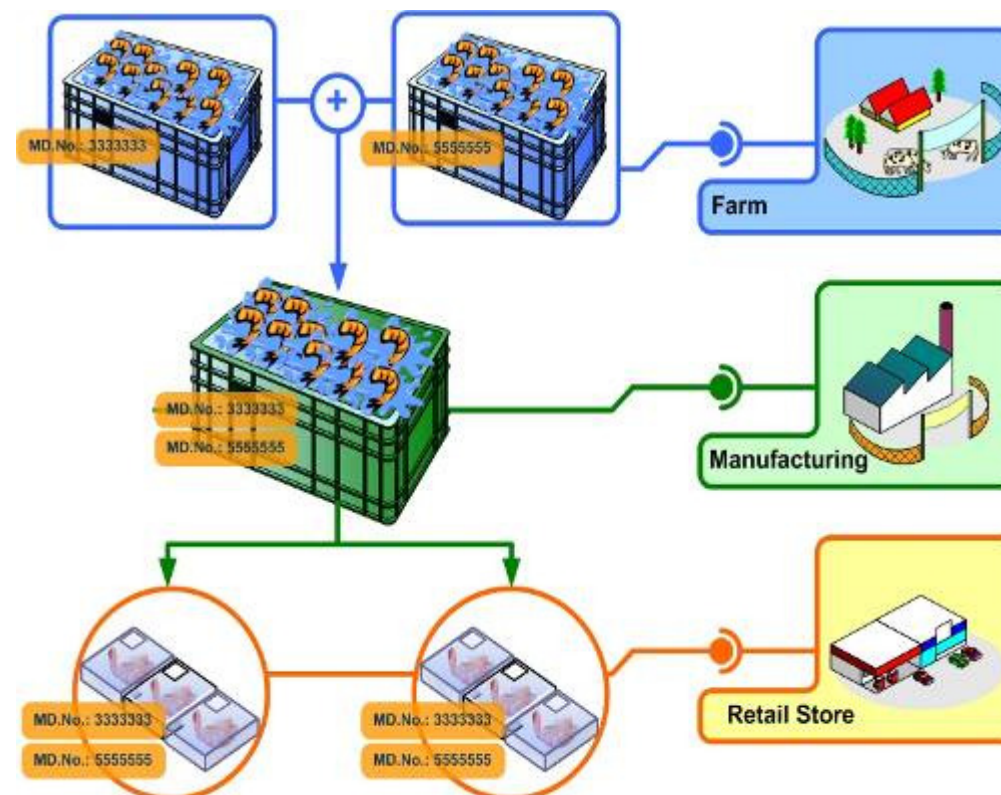
Smarter Supply Chain - Food Safety and Cold Chain Management

Product Velocity → Ensure product freshness

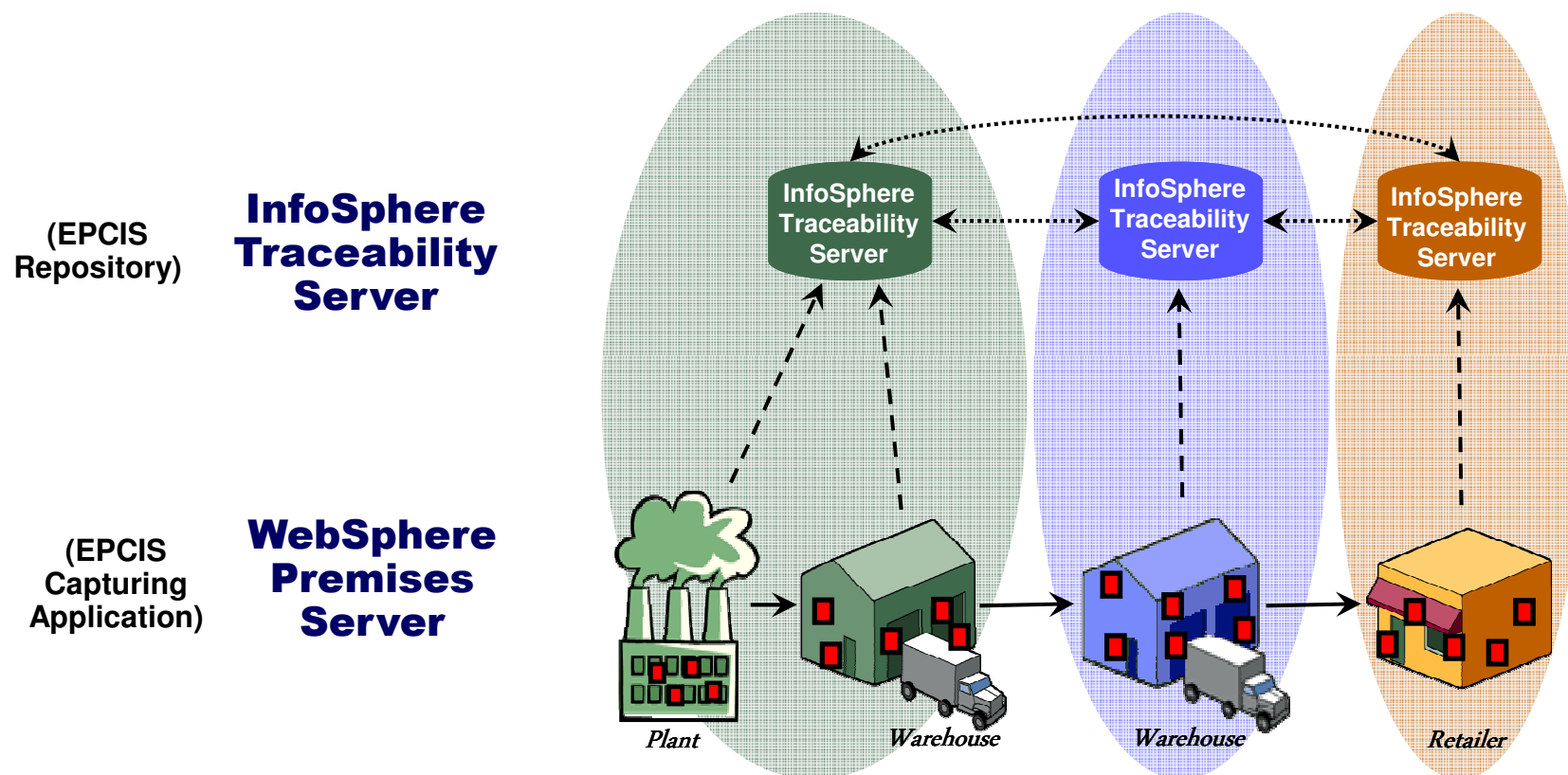
Product Condition → Track temperature & humidity

Product Recall → Trace product origin and track current location

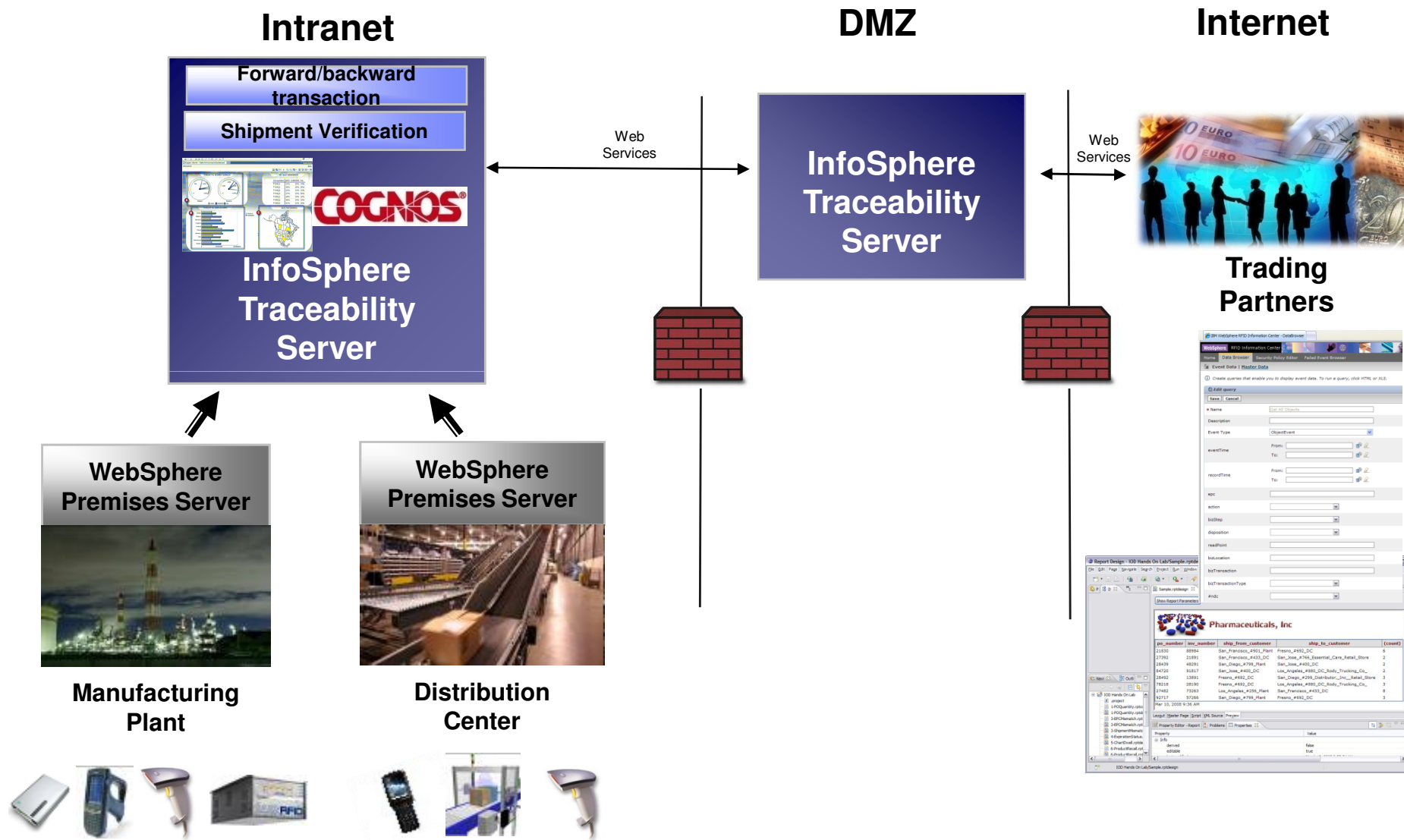
Shrimp Traceability Example



InfoSphere Traceability Server Sample Implementation

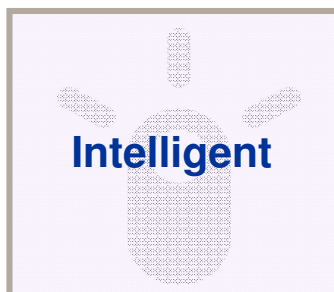
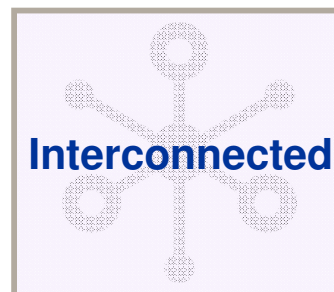
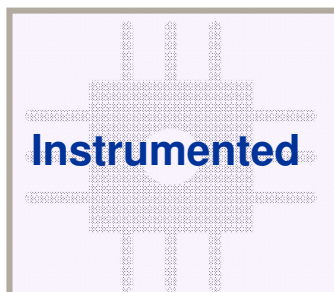


InfoSphere Traceability Server Architecture

Automated Transactions & Smart Devices

- Use of sensors, actuators, RFID, & smart devices to automate transactions: inventory location, shelf-level replenishment detection, transportation locations & bottlenecks
- Supports real-time data collection & transparency from POS to manufacturing to raw material
- Sense-and-respond demand/supply signals allow “predict and act”

Optimized Flows

- ERP to ERP to ERP system integration across the network. Standardized data and processes.
- Collaborative decision making through decision support and business intelligence – starting with the customer
- C-Suite risk management programs for integrated financial controls with operational performance – monitored and measured

Networked Planning, Execution & Decision Analysis
