IBM Content Manager - V7.1 (NT/Win2000/AIX)

Functional Enhancements Delivered	What it means to our customers
Document Mgmt - ODMA	Provides an easy way for Windows users to store PC documents and files into CM, or to retrieve items directly from CM via their Windows desktop application (File - Save As, or 'File-Open')
Document Mgmt - Version Control	Provides users the ability to update a document (add annotations, pages, add parts) and save the revised document back as a new version of the old document, or as a completely new document. Subsequently, users are aware that multiple versions exist, and may retrieve the version they need
Windows 2000 Server Logo Certification	Mandatory in the marketplace to compete. Customers benefit from system services and management capabilities with W2000 Certif.
Multivalue Attributes	Allows items to be indexed such that one attribute (ex. Name) includes a list of values. Ex. An Insurance claim may list 3 claimants under the attribute 'Claimant'
XML/Electronic Forms Support * available 03/31/01, via EIP/Client Kit	These interfaces will allow XML structured documents such as e-forms (key to web-based transactions and workflow) to be stored & indexed into the CM server. Integration prototypes with ActionPoint is in process. Integration with Jetforms and Adobe is actively being pursued
Content Manager e-Client * available 03/31/01, via EIP/Client Kit	Supports viewing of the broad formats of content customers use: Images (tiff, modca), AFP. (Office documents date TBD in 2001)
Object Server Replication, Run multiple Library Servers on a system	Replication from one object server to another of an index class by configuration/setup for disaster recovery. Multiple Library servers supports distinct environments running on one physical server.

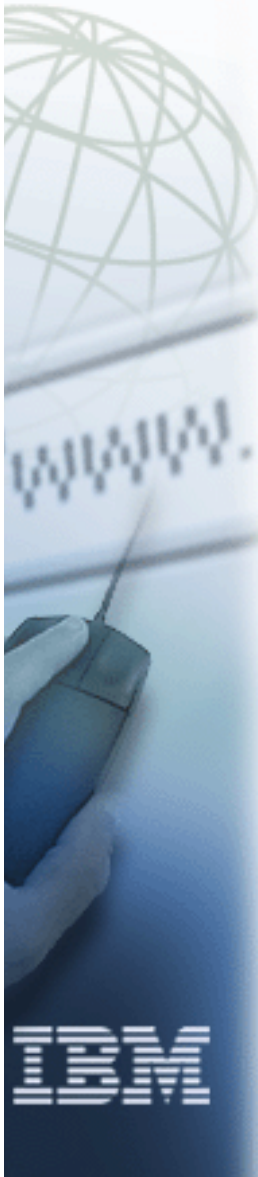
