'Bring Your Own Device' (BYOD) now accepted by most enterprises


4-4	Employees Pick The Phone They Want




2011: Mobile devices surpass PC sales





- Other IBM social mobility solutions on roadmap









Findings of the 2011 IBM Tech Trends Report





- Mobile is viewed by respondents as the second most "in demand" area for software development"
